Proposed FY18 Executive Board Slate

Approved at April 20, 2017 LibraryLinkNJ Executive Board Meeting

Background. In accordance with the LibraryLinkNJ Bylaws, the Board Nominating Committee submits a slate for membership consideration and action at the Spring Membership Meeting. This FY18 Executive Board Slate was developed by Board Nominating Committee members Lynn Pascale, Chair, with Steve Chudnick and Karen Brodsky. It was approved by the LibraryLinkNJ Executive Board at their meeting on April 20, 2017 for submission to the membership.

Action. The proposed Executive Board Slate for FY18 is as follows:

Cathy Boss, Jersey Shore University Medical Center Library (Monmouth County), Special Library Representative, Three-year term: July 1, 2017 through June 30, 2020

Cathy has been the Coordinator of Library Services at the Booker Health Sciences Library, Jersey Shore University Medical Center for the past 20 years. In that capacity, Cathy has coordinated library services for the health system and taught Internet searching and library orientation classes. Prior to that Cathy was Library Director at another Medical Center for 25 year where she taught similar classes as well. She has a Bachelor's degree in Library Science, a Master of Science degree in Library Science, is a Distinguished Member of Academy of Health Information Professionals, the credentialing body of the Medical Library Association and has Level II Specialization in Consumer Health Information from the Association. Cathy has presented 27 papers and posters, authored 4 book chapters, 5 journals articles, and been awarded over \$50,000 in grant monies during her career. She is a part-time lecturer in Rutgers University's School of Communication and Information in their Masters of Library Science program. On a personal note, she has been married for 45 years and has 3 daughters, the oldest of whom is a librarian at Jersey College. Much of her free time is spent with her 2 grandchildren Elizabeth and Aaron, and with church ministries.

Michelle McGreivey, Hoboken High School Library (Hudson County), Member at Large, Three-year term: July 1, 2017 through June 30, 2020

I have been a School Library Media Specialist at Hoboken High School in Hoboken, NJ since 2002. Prior to that, I worked in a variety of public, academic and special libraries in New Jersey, South Carolina and Louisiana. I got my MLS in 1990 at SUNY Albany, and earned my SLMS certification through classes at Rutgers and St. Peter's College. I have been active in NJASL (New Jersey Association of School Librarians), managing the NJASL regular and board listservs for several years, as well as assisting in a variety of ways with planning the annual NJASL conference. I have served as secretary of NJASL since 2014. I was named the Hoboken High School Teacher of the Year in 2011-2012.

Jennifer Podolsky, East Brunswick Public Library, Member-at-Large (Middlesex County), Three-year term: July 1, 2017 through June 30, 2020

I have been the Director of East Brunswick Public Library since 2015. Prior to my tenure at East Brunswick I was the Project Specialist for Business and Technology Outreach at the New Jersey State Library. There I spearheaded many popular statewide initiatives including the Mobile Device Discovery Kit Program, Mental Health First Aid Training and NJGrowsBiz. With over ten years of experience, I have has served in management, research, and editorial positions in both publishing and libraries. I started my career as the Senior Research Editor at Reed Elsevier, where I supervised a staff of researchers and was responsible for the research library. I worked as a Youth Services Librarian for the Somerset County Library System and was a volunteer Research Librarian for the archives department of the Ellis Island Immigration Museum. My diverse library background also includes working as a Media Specialist in several New Jersey School districts including Millburn, Middletown, and Califon Public School where I was also the Technology Teacher for grades K-8.
